We will be encouraging visitors to buy our \$15.00 local membership which includes \$5.00 off a plant, entrance into CSRG and a free book.

Dick Cavender reported that the boiler at the Smith Garden house needs to be replaced and bids are being taken.

Steve Kaminski reported that the Chapter website has been cleaned up and that the roster is almost finished.

Kathy Van Veen moved that the Chapter buy a brick paver for use at the RSB Garden; that motion was seconded. In discussion, it was suggested that a paver should be purchased by Smith Garden and Crystal Springs, also. Discussion will continue at the next board meeting when we find out how much each brick paver costs.

The Convention was discussed at length.

The transition between Events Coordinators was discussed at length and will be continued with the committee assigned to facilitating the transition.

An Invitation to Visit the Hinsdale Garden from Gordon Wylie

Wednesday, May 25th has been set as the date for our spring visit to the Hinsdale Garden this year. We'll get started about 10:00 AM and go until done, probably around 3:00 to 4:00 PM. Recent changes include a good number of rhododendrons planted last fall and a large grouping of evergreen and deciduous azaleas at the main entry in April this year. Plus, the new bridge to the main garden now provides an easy walk in place of the former temporary plank crossing that sometimes resulted in wet feet.

Parking will be as before at the lot east of the garden and carpooling is encouraged. The Eugene Chapter plans to rent a bus for a group tour with lunch included, and for relaxed visiting among members on the way down and back. Other Chapters may wish to consider this approach.

Come and see all that's going on in this impressive garden being refurbished in partnership between Oregon ARS members and the U.S. Bureau of Land Management...a good way to begin winding down from the busy season of flower shows, garden visits and this year's Annual ARS Convention.
